Last month the Mobile County Commission announced that work will begin in July on the property located between Mobile Government Plaza and the County Government Annex; eventually transforming the site into the new Mobile Government Plaza Pocket Park. Construction plans are aimed at creating an appealing space for outdoor lunches, breaks, meetings and small community events. Key features include a new circular fountain as the focal point; upgraded landscaping and green space; new benches, lighting and flagpoles; paver replacement for improved walkability; and security cameras. Almost 1,000 people work in Government Plaza, and the Downtown Mobile Alliance estimates nearly 20,000 are employed across the Downtown Mobile area. Funded by the American Rescue Plan Act, the \$1.4-million project was created to create a safer, greener and more inviting outdoor space. Build out is anticipated to be finished by February 2026. WAS Design, Inc. provided design services, and the construction contract was awarded to J. Payne Organization, Inc.

The Frenchman Mobile, a local art space collective, is hosting a grand reopening of its new space in Downtown Mobile, to be marked by a ceremony on July 11. The Excelsior Brass Band will lead a parade featuring the Azalea Trail Maids, Never Greens, and The Frenchmen Partners. The festivities will start at the shop's current location, 12c

North Jackson Street, then progress to the new venue found at 222 Dauphin Street for the ribbon-cutting. The shop owners stated that the new space brings greater visibility, easier access for shoppers and an expanded platform for the 70-plus artists, makers and small businesses comprising the artist association.

Inc., announced the lease last month of an 800-square-foot office suite with a private restroom to Total Mobility Physical therapy located at 3925 Springhill Avenue in West Mobile.
