THE REAL ESTATE CORNER:



It June it was announced that the estimated cost of a major expansion project at Evonik's Theodore manufacturing facility was increased to \$380 million, more than double the \$176.5 million projection announced in 2022. Representatives for the Essen, Germany-based chemical manufacturer told the Mobile County Commission that inflation, design delays, and higher material plus labor costs contributed to the increase. The commission

approved an amended agreement to reflect the revised investment amount and updated construction schedule. County officials said Evonik is not seeking additional tax incentives as part of the amendment. The project includes construction of a new facility to produce methyl mercaptan, a key component used in the manufacture of MetAmino (DL methionine), an animal feed additive. The facility is expected to begin operations on Nov. 30, several years later than originally anticipated. When first announced, the expansion was projected to generate \$24 million in new state tax revenue and \$26.8 million in payroll over a 20-year period through construction and permanent employment opportunities.

Ray-Mont Logistics, a Canadian-based logistics company, plans to establish a new export-focused transloading facility at the Port of Mobile, marking its third U.S. location and first operation on the Gulf Coast. According to the Alabama Port Authority, the facility is expected to add approximately 60,000 twenty-foot equivalent units (TEUs) of annual export volume once the first phase is fully operational. The initial phase will focus on bagging plastic resin pellets for shipment in export containers. The facility is also expected to support increased exports of plastic resin packaging, forest products and other commodities. Construction is planned on property owned by the Alabama Export Railroad, with operations expected to begin later this year. The project has been under development since 2021. Port officials said the additional export capacity will further strengthen Mobile's position as a growing logistics and trade hub along the Gulf Coast.

A 5,364-square-foot commercial property at 4313 Downtowner Loop located in West Mobile sold in June. The transaction was brokered by Steadman Bethea and Gantt Wilkinson of Stirling Properties. Terms of the sale were not announced.

A 1.53-acre Microtel Inn & Suites property in Saraland was sold to an out-of-state investor last month following strong market interest and was also handled by Sthanki and Wilkinson with Stirling Properties. Additional financial terms were not disclosed.

Last month Stirling Properties advisor Jill Meeks represented the seller in the divestiture of a 5,000-square-foot flex property located at 4916 Oak Circle Drive North in Mobile. The property was acquired by Scott Peach and Bridget Grant-Peach. Terms of the transaction were not disclosed.
