Melinda Ladnier (Center Manager at AIDT Maritime Training Center)

Melinda Ladnier joined the AIDT Maritime Training Center in January of 2009, specializing in workforce development for the maritime industry. She is currently the Center Manager; overseeing the day-to-day operations of the training center, which focuses on providing no-cost craft training for various skilled trades to support Alabama shipbuilders.

Melinda is an NCCER Master Trainer and was the first person to be awarded the Maritime Industry Safety and Health Management Certificate from the University of Alabama in 2022.

AIDT Maritime Training Center

The AIDT Maritime Training Center in Mobile is a state-operated workforce development facility dedicated to preparing individuals for careers in the maritime and industrial sectors. Operated by Alabama Industrial Development Training (AIDT), the center provides hands-on training designed to support the region's growing shipbuilding and port industries. The 67,000-square-foot facility includes classrooms, computer labs, and a large training floor equipped with dozens of welding booths, a CNC plasma table, and other tools used in real-world maritime environments.

The center focuses on high-demand craft training such as welding, pipefitting, structural fitting, blueprint reading, and marine design. Many programs follow nationally recognized certifications like NCCER, helping participants gain the skills and credentials needed to enter the workforce quickly. Through its industry-driven training programs and partnerships with employers, the AIDT Maritime Training Center plays a key role in strengthening the workforce pipeline and supporting the continued growth of Mobile's maritime economy.



THE REAL ESTATE CORNER:



Mobile County's economy and business landscape continued to show forward momentum, according to last month's federal data release and a series of commercial real estate moves.

February federal figures showed Mobile County's real gross domestic product increased by approximately \$2.046 billion between 2022 and 2024, a 9.2% gain over 2022 levels.

The delayed data, released after last fall's federal government shutdown, indicated the county's economy expanded by \$949 million in 2024 alone, lifting total real GDP to \$24.3 billion. That represented a 4.06% annual growth rate, exceeding both state and national averages. Mobile County accounted for about 13% of Alabama's total economic growth in 2024, ranking second statewide behind Madison County. The county's growth rate also outpaced several of Alabama's largest markets, including Jefferson, Montgomery, Tuscaloosa and Baldwin counties. By comparison, Alabama's economy grew 2.95% in 2024 to \$255.6 billion, while the national economy expanded 2.79% to \$23.36 trillion. Officials have pointed to infrastructure investment as a factor supporting regional performance, including \$3 million in federal funding for tarmac improvements at Mobile International Airport.

Commercial real estate activity announced recently was also positive. Merrill P. Thomas Co. Inc. announced the sale of a 21,000-square-foot commercial property at 5502 and 5492 Todd Acres Drive in West Mobile for \$2.45 million. The transaction involved a private trust as seller and Gulf Properties Holdings LLC as buyer. Mike Reid of Merrill P. Thomas Co. Inc. represented both parties, and Pratt Thomas, CCIM, served as co-listing agent. The site includes a 21,000-square-foot building situated on approximately 6.7 acres, according to the brokerage. The buyer plans to reserve the space for future use. While redevelopment plans were not revealed, the property's scale and location position it for potential use aligned with longer-term growth trends in the area.

In a separate transaction, Merrill P. Thomas Co. Inc. reported the sale of 90 Springdale Blvd. in West Mobile to Create Program Inspire LLC. The property is slated to become the Azalea City Center for the Arts, a performing arts venue intended to support community and educational programming. Planned resident and anchor organizations include Sunny Side Theater, Full Scale School of Music, Floretta P. Carson Visual & Performing Arts Academy, Classical Ballet of Mobile, Macrossan Irish Step and Mobile County Public Schools.

Retail leasing was also in play last month. Wingstop leased a 1,500-square-foot space inside the Midtown Mobile Shopping Center at Old Shell Road and Florida Street. Jay O'Brien of Stirling Properties represented the tenant. The fast-casual chain is expected to open this summer, with rumors of other sites opening soon.
