



## LET IT SNOW, LET IT SNOW



Theodore-headquartered aluminum boat builder, Silver Ships, Inc., announced in September their opening of a second location. The new manufacturing warehouse is situated about a mile from the company's original 95,000square-foot facility. The new site adds 16,500-square-feet of manufacturing space and 18,500 square-feet of outfitting space above and beyond the original facilities. "Adding a second manufacturing location is a natural progression of our team's work to support the growing workboat segment,"

Steven Clarke, Silver Ships CEO said. The new footprint will serve as a metal warehouse and hold the design and engineering departments. Silver Ships will transport materials to the new locale this month to begin the build-out process, and anticipates hiring more employees during development.

Locally owned Fast Trak DPF recently announced their official grand opening at its 1,800-square-foot diesel particulate filter (DPF) cleaning service center, located at 6221 Sperry Road in Theodore. The company specializes in treatment plans for diesel-powered vehicles and heavy equipment to ensure efficient engine performance, reducing the risk of expensive emission component damage. "The busy travel season brings increased traffic and construction projects, making our services particularly relevant, considering the increased attention to air pollution and environmental sustainability," the company announced in a prepared statement.

The Mobile Airport Authority (MAA) recently announced that it was awarded a little over \$7.5 million through the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law Airport Infrastructure Grant program. The funds will support the ongoing development of the Mobile International Airport located at 2455 Michigan Ave. "The new terminal is key to accommodating future growth and driving economic development in the region. We're excited about our partnership with the Federal Aviation Administration, as we continue to work towards the completion of our transformative project." Chris Curry, MAA president said.

Three merchant storefronts found on St. Louis Street in Downtown Mobile are now actively on the market with a total asking price of \$3.7 million. Located on the same city block, the properties collectively encompass some 5,000-square feet of space. Birmingham-based commercial real estate operator Shannon Waltchack is managing the deal. The listings are all local businesses and include The Cheese Cottage, BoHayden's and Wingman Brewing Company.

The new South Alabama Family Care Walk-In Clinic, found at 10067 Grand Bay Wilmer Road South, Suite 100 in Grand Bay, officially opened its doors last month. The facility is an expansion of South Alabama's primary clinic. Five years in the making, the care center will be open 7 days a week and is fully staffed. "We get people from Mississippi, Bayou La Batre and Irvington coming to Grand Bay. It's pretty convenient rather than going to Mobile," Nurse Practitioner Parath Knight said. Ruston, Louisiana-based Origin Bank opened its 1,900-square foot Financial Center at the corner of Du Rhu Drive and Dauphin Street in September, and this is the bank's first office in Mobile. "Our entry into South Alabama and Florida earlier this year was a significant step in our long-term growth strategy," Drake Mills, chairman, president and CEO of Origin said. The center offers personal and business banking, commercial lending and treasury management.

SSAB announced a \$12-million upgrade project at its steel mill in Axis last month. The investment will enable SSAB Alabama to extend its existing furnace and upgrade shot blasting equipment to increase its quenching and tempering (QT) capacity by 30,000 metric tons - an increase of about 10 percent. Operations for the upgrade are expected to begin by fourth quarter 2025.
